Nathan writes his sister in the United States:

“Germany.

March 29, 1945.

Just a few lines today to let you know that I am alright and that I made out O.K. You know more about it back home from the papers than I am allowed to tell you Sis. So don't worry as I am alright. I was wondering if we made the headlines this time. All I can say is Sis that it sure wasn't fun and I will properly turn gray headed several years before my time from it...I'll try to answer all your questions when I get a little time...So Sis write and don't worry and give my love to the kids...
