## The U.S. Coast Guard orders a summary court martial:

"April 2, 1945

Specifications of offenses preferred against Oren X, radioman third class, U. S. Coast Guard Reserve.

SPECIFICATION 1 – In that Oren X, radioman third class, U. S. Coast Guard Reserve, attached to the USCGC X, and while so serving on board said ship, having, on X March, 1945, been regularly detailed to stand the radio watch between the hours of 0001 and 0600 on said date, and having entered upon his duties as radio watch on board said ship, did, at or about 1:45 a.m. on X March, 1945, sleep while on said watch; the United States then being in a state of war.

SPECIFICATION 2 – In that Oren X, radioman third class, U. S. Coast Guard Reserve, attached to the USCGC X, and while so serving on board said ship, having, on X March, 1945, been regularly detailed to stand the radio watch between the hours of 0001 and 0600 on said date, on board said vessel, and having entered upon his duties as radio watch on board said ship, did, at or about 2:10 a.m., X March, 1945, without authority, leave his station and duty before being regularly relieved; the United States then being in a state of war.

Approved April 2, 1945.

To be tried before the summary court martial of which Lieutenant (j.g.) X, U. S. Coast Guard Reserve, is senior member.
